- Final Words of Encouragement: On Sunday, 3/8 (the last day I was with the men at Donovan), I was able to warn them of the very real possibility that they were not going to see me for a very long time. Given the looming shutdown (our current reality), I expressed my deep gratitude for how God had used them to bless and minister to me in a great variety of ways, as anyone who has ever spent any time behind the wall thoroughly knows! In addition to expressing gratitude through tears, I was able to encourage, empower, and remind them that I am not the church, nor is the chapel the church, but that THEY ARE THE CHURCH, and that they need to remain in the Word, and have Bible studies and prayer groups wherever and however as often as they are able. It was a moving moment like the final speech of Brave Heart where everyone feels built up and ready to go! 6
- · Letters of Hope: While I have not been allowed to have physical contact with the men, they have been in my prayers, and I have been graciously allowed by the Chaplain to communicate with them every fortnight via a one page letter of encouragement and hope. Writing and praying into the impact of that correspondence has been a special gem in my life. 😊
- An Administrative Blessing: As King David made preparations to build the temple of the LORD for his son Solomon, during this time of waiting, I have been able to make a great multitude of administrative preparations for all of the programs I facilitate at the institution. When that glorious day comes when they open the doors. I will be ready.
