Thank you very much for your donations towards this ministry through the Pastors to Prisoners Organization. I am very grateful to you.

This month Fr Manny Sundaram, the Catholic priest, resigned from his duties and with his resignation some volunteers have had to step in to cover some of the programs that he was supervising. I volunteered to supervise the Native American group on Tuesdays until a new priest is hired.

My new schedule is as follows:

MONDAYS: Facility B Level IV: Spanish Bible Study from 6:30-8:00 p.m.

TUESDAYS: Facility A Level IV: Spanish Bible Study from 6:30--8:30 p.m.

TUESDAYS: Facility B Level IV: Supervise the Native Americans from 10:30–11:30 a.m.

FRIDAYS: Facility C Level III: Spanish Bible Study from 9:00-11:00 a.m.

FRIDAYS: Facility D Level II: Spanish Bible Study from 6:30-8:30 p.m..

SATURDAYS: Facility E Level I: Bilingual Worship from 10:00–11:45 a.m.

SATURDAYS: Facility C Level III Spanish Worship from 12:30 –2:15 p.m. with Volunteers

SATURDAYS: Facility C Level II English Worship from 2:30–4:00 p.m. with Volunteers

SATURDAYS: Facility D Level II Bilingual Worship from 6:30-8:30 p.m.

February 2020 Report (Continued)

Facility D Level II Update: Many lifers have been granted freedom this month after so many years of being in prison. Six brothers from this Facility left and some were deported to their countries. We prayed for them before leaving so that God will open doors for them. In the meanwhile, the congregation continues growing every week. Praise God!

Chaplain Park has done a wonderful job cleaning and organizing not only this chapel, but all the chapels in the institution. He is a very organized and hard working man. He is always trying to meet the prisoner's spiritual needs. At times it is hard to understand him because of his language barrier, but he gets his job done.

Facility C Level III Update: The population in this Facility continues to be low, even though some level IV inmates have been arriving lately to this yard. The State educational programs has taken a toll in the religious programs because almost all the inmates in this yard are involved in those programs. I used to have about 30-35 inmates in my Friday Bible class, now I get four or five. The inmates are in class, which is a good thing because inmates are getting their GED"s and college degrees so that they can get a better job when they exit prison.

Saturday services continue to be well attended and inmates come and go, but JESUS is the same and there is a part of the inmate that the State can not fill, and that is the spiritual need that they have when they feel depressed, lonely or suicidal. Only God can fulfill that need that other programs can not fill. That's why the religious programs continue in all the yards and inmates surrender their lives to Jesus.

Facilities A and B Level IV Update: I continue providing Bible studies in these two facilities on Monday and Tuesday evenings. The program in Facility A is going very well. A small faithful group of inmates attend the service and they seem very interested in learning more about the Bible. They behave well and have not given me problems as of this date, thank God.

On the other hand the inmates from Facility B are not behaving very well. They were recently locked down for three weeks because they were involved in a fight. I opted for having only 10-15 inmates in my class because if more come, they get distracted very easily.

Recently I was distributing bibles and calendars in the SHU (Segregation Housing Unit) and I met this young man who was sentenced to several life sentences plus 159 years in prison. He felt that he was born to be in prison. His parents abandoned him when he was very little, and at a young age he spent ten years in Juvenile Hall. He is now a hit man who has committed various homicides. The last inmate he attempted to kill did not die, and he is facing four years in the SHU plus the rest of his life in prison. I was able to minister to him for a long time since he was going to be transferred that evening to another prison. He said the sinner's prayer and I gave him a Bible. God has put the burden on my heart to pray for him every day. I know that if he is saved he will be a tremendous testimony of the power of God to the world. Please pray for him. His name is Cruz. Thank you.
