Hi brother Bill,

I hope this letter finds you in health and peace. I am truly grateful to the Lord that he has opened the prison doors for me once more, now that this pandemic Corona virus is subsiding. I have been attending Lerdo facility where I have been scheduled on Fridays and Saturdays to give 3 to 4 services. Praise the Lord. If a volunteer fails to show up, Chaplain Ben Lopez knows I will fill in.

I have been receiving six hundred Daily Bread booklets directly from their ministry which I pass out to inmates and to some of the chaplains at Wasco and Delano State Prisons. I am also leading Bible studies at two men's homes and one reentry men's home on Mondays and Tuesdays.

I have been in close contact with Chaplain Greg Findlay and Chaplain Joe Lombardi at Wasco State Prison. At Kern Valley State Prison (maximum security), I am in contact with Chaplain Francis Diaz. He has told me he can't wait to get me back in there. Thank you, Jesus. I have great hope these doors open soon. Before this pandemic hit, I was putting 30 to 40 hours a week at the prison, and I enjoyed every minute; just to be able to bring hope and shed some light on the love of Jesus Christ.

Brother Bill, I cannot express my deepest gratitude from my heart for the support the Pastors to Prisoners has given me to be able to continue this great work of the Lord. I am truly a blessed man. May God continue blessing you and yours and Pastors to Prisoners and all the prison volunteers; you are in our prayers.
